Austin, TX— On Monday, Feb. 7, Scott McCown, Executive Director of the Center for Public Policy Priorities (CPPP)—recently named by *Texas Monthly* as one of the "25 Most Powerful People in Texas Politics"—will release **Border KIDS COUNT: A Snapshot of Southwest Border Children**.
