This fall, Congress is considering cutting Medicaid funding by \$10 billion over the next five years. Texas could stand to lose \$600 million. Experts will urge Congress to proceed with caution: encouraging changes that will control Medicaid costs through better care and smarter purchasing, without compromising health care for Texas' most vulnerable.
