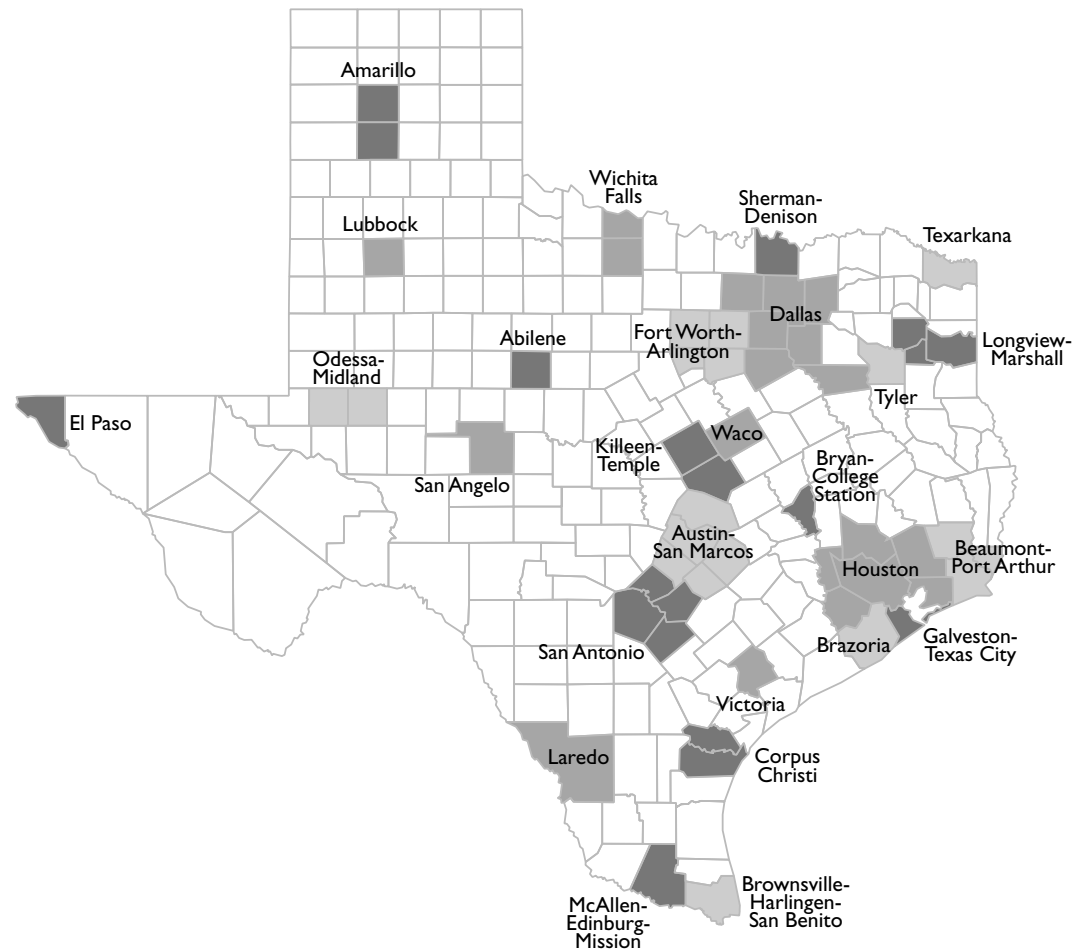


Texas Metropolitan Statistical Areas
