Take Action: U.S. House to Decide This Week Whether to Cut Billions in Services

Beginning today, the U.S. House of Representatives will vote on a budget reconciliation bill that would result in \$50 billion in spending cuts to Medicaid, Food Stamps, and other vital services for vulnerable families and children to help fund \$70 billion in tax cuts. (Other cuts include child support enforcement, SSI disability benefits, child care, foster care assistance, and student loans.)

These spending cuts couldn't come at a worse time for Texas. Poverty and hunger are on the rise and Texas continues to have the highest rate of uninsured adults and kids in the country. Hurricanes Katrina and Rita have only added to the numbers of those who need help.
